NSPCC-Talking PANTS Campaign

During the summer the NSPCC ran their *Speak Out Stay Safe* campaign in school encouraging the children to tell someone if they had any concerns about themselves or others. The children were introduced to the Childline website and number – 0800 1111.

The next step is for us to focus on the 'Talk PANTS' underwear rule lessons which build on the pupils being able to keep themselves safe. These lessons are delivered in a child friendly and fun way to encourage the children to talk sensibly about what they should do. It will be built in to PSHE lessons throughout the first week but doesn't use scary stories or technical terms. It is all 'age appropriate' and will be delivered by the teachers in Foundation 2 through to Year 6.

We would like to encourage all parents/carers to follow up on this work. To support you the NSPCC has produced a Parent's Guide which outlines suggested approaches. This can be found on the NSPCC link:

Anti-Bullying Week

Following on from the NSPCC campaigns is the national Anti-Bullying week that starts on November 13th. The title for this year is *'All Different, All Equal'*. During that week the key focus will be on understanding that we are all different from each other and that those differences are to be celebrated – not used as a reason to make someone else feel bad about themselves. In particular, we will be focussing on pupil resilience and knowing how, where and from whom they can seek help whenever they feel low, unhappy or upset. As usual when we are talking about bullying it heightens your child's thoughts about how others treat them so again they may be asking you questions.
