Science Fairs

Once again we will be holding our Science Fairs for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 this term as well as Foundation having a Science Day. The theme this year will be linked to the 'Polar Explorer Programme' and the new Polar research boat the 'RSS Sir David Attenborough'. We have received some resources from STEM Learning as we have been chosen to be part of a project promoting science in schools and we will be adapting these for our curriculum. We will let you know the dates for the fairs ASAP and the annual competitions once we have had our training from the STEM Polar Ambassador.

Battery Recycling

We have also been asked to be part of the 'Big Battery Hunt', a nationwide recycling campaign supported by Duracell. We will have sent out the recycling boxes with this newsletter. The aim is for individual children and the school to collect as many old batteries as possible by Friday, 20th April. There are prizes on offer from Duracell for the most batteries collected by a school nationally but the main reason for the event is to help children understand the reasons behind recycling. Once collected the batteries can be brought in to school and placed in a 'school recycling' box.

Attendance and Late Arrival

We will be sending out letters soon that will bring to parents attention if their child is **below** the 90% 'Persistent Absentee' benchmark set by the government **or is in danger of doing so** if they have any more absence. Please be aware that any child arriving after 9:20am will also be counted as 'absent' for this purpose unless an appropriate reason can be provided. Attendance at school is vital for pupils' educational and social development. The school understands that children may be absent for illness but we have a statutory duty to ensure maximum attendance possible for our pupils

Free School Meal Entitlement

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit* (WTC) and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- *You can get this help if you get Working Tax Credit and you are in the four week 'run-on' period where your WTC is due to stop because you have stopped work or reduced your hours
- Universal Credit

Children in Foundation 2 (Reception), Year 1 and Year 2 are able to have a universal free school meal by right, however if you are eligible for free school meals and your child is in these classes **we strongly advise** still applying. Your child would then have additional rights to financial support in school for school visits, and support with their work, etc. The website to apply is listed below.
