There has been an increase in children wearing jewellery in school since lockdown. Our apologies, but we do not allow most jewellery in school due to health and safety. It is part of the agreed school policy. Our School Prospectus states:

The wearing of any jewellery in school can be hazardous and is best kept for out of school hours. It can also be upsetting when expensive or treasured items get lost. Children may wear a watch and studs/small sleepers in pierced ears.

In P.E. lessons, it can be dangerous to wear jewellery of any kind. Children wearing jewellery will be expected to remove it themselves, as adults in school are not allowed to. It is therefore advised that no jewellery is worn on PE days.
